MUSEUM ENTRY POLICIES

What protective health measures are in place at TarraWarra Museum of Art?

The Museum has implemented a number of new measures in response to the coronavirus pandemic, including but not limited to:

the introduction of timed entry ticketing to comply with venue capacity limits;
limits upon the number of visitors allowed in each gallery space;

- hand sanitiser stations at multiple points within the Museum;

- increased cleaning regimes across the Museum and its amenities, especially for high touch surfaces;

acrylic screens at the reception desk;
social distancing signage throughout the venue.

What are your new conditions of entry?

Visitors to the Museum must abide by the following conditions of entry:

all visitors must provide their contact details in accordance with Government regulations relating to coronavirus contact tracing. All information will be stored securely and destroyed after 28 days;
visitors should not enter the Museum if they are feeling unwell or have been overseas in the last 14 days;

- visitors are asked to use hand sanitiser upon arrival and exit;

- visitors must wear a face mask, unless an exemption applies;

- visitors must abide by social distancing guidelines at all times and remain 1.5m from other groups;

- visitors must comply with staff directions relating to overall venue capacity and individual gallery space capacities.

Visitors who do not comply with these conditions will not be admitted to the Museum.

Please note that cloaking is currently unavailable, and all large items should be left securely inside your vehicle. Food and drinks are not permitted inside the Museum. Umbrellas may be left at the entrance.

Visitors who arrive by public transport can make special requests for cloaking at the front desk.

Is photography allowed in the exhibition? Yes, photography is permitted without flash. The use of a selfie-stick or tripod is prohibited.

What are the Museum's opening hours?

Tuesday to Sunday, 11am to 5pm. Open all public holidays except Christmas Day. Open 7 days a week from Boxing Day to Australia Day.

Do I need to buy tickets for a specific time?

To assist with venue capacity limits, TarraWarra Museum of Art has implemented timed entry ticketing.

Timed entry sessions are available on the hour at 11am, 12pm, 1pm, 2pm, 3pm and 4pm. Please arrive at the Museum within 1 hour of the session time indicated on your ticket. Latecomers will be admitted, but may need to queue for entry. You are welcome to stay as long as you wish once inside the Museum.

Pre-booking tickets online is highly recommended, however tickets are also available at the door, even if your preferred session time is booked out. People buying tickets at the door may experience delays should the Museum be at capacity.

Contactless payments are preferred.

Are guided tours available?

Due to social distancing restrictions, we are not offering guided tours at this time.

Will the exhibition be accompanied by any public programs?

Can I exchange my tickets for another date?

It is important that you arrive in time to enter the exhibition within your allocated session. If you are late, you may be required to queue for entry.

How do I get to TarraWarra Museum of Art?

TarraWarra Museum of Art's address is: 313 Healesville-Yarra Glen Rd Healesville VIC 3777

The Museum is located in the beautiful Yarra Valley region, one hour's drive north-east of Melbourne and a ten minute drive from the regional hub of Healesville.

From Melbourne, catch the train to Lilydale Station then join connecting bus route 685 (Lilydale-Healesville). Visit <u>ptv.vic.gov.au</u> for timetables and further details.

Is TarraWarra Museum of Art fully accessible?

Yes, all Gallery spaces are fully accessible for those using walking frames and wheelchairs.

Accessible car parks are available close to the Museum entry as well as wheelchair accessible toilet facilities.
